Vintage Easy Baby Blanket



Can be worked with any yarn. VERY IMPORTANT TO DO TEST SWATCH FIRST AND DETERMINE YOUR STITCH & ROW GAUGE FOR THE YARN YOU SELECT.

MATERIALS:

Yarn: enough yardage for the finished size that you determine.

For example: for a 36"x 36" finished measurement, estimate approximately*:

1100 yards using DK weight (5 st"/8 r" in garter stitch)

1000 yards using worsted weight (4 ½ st"/7 r" in garter stitch)

750 yards using chunky weight (3 ½ st"/ 6 r" in garter stitch)

* NOTE: (actual yardage is determined by the yarn, gauge & finished measurements that <u>you</u> determine. Calculate approximately + or - 100-150 yards per inch overall to increase or decrease finished measurement.

Knitting Needle: 29" or longer circular needle in size for your gauge and yarn. **Tapestry needle** to weave in ends.

DIRECTIONS:

Cast on, loosely, 4 stitches.

*Row 1: K1, increase 1, k to end of row.

Row 2: K1, increase 1, k to end of row.*

Repeat * to * until you achieve desired width.

Then:

**Row 1: K1, decrease 1, k to end of row.

Row 2: K1, decrease 1, k to end of row.**

Repeat ** to ** until there are 4 stitches remaining.

Bind off loosely.

FINISHING:

Weave in ends.

Trim (optional): the increase and decrease for each row will create small openings. For accent, thread a ribbon through openings for the effect that you desire.

Or, crochet an edge around entire blanket according to your desired finished effect.
