



Weavers Wool Quarters Sock Pattern



This pattern is a modified version of one of Susan Banner's designs and is prepared with her permission. Thanks to Susan not only for her exquisite creativity and expertise but also for her kindness.

YARN: 1 skein Mountain Colors WEAVERS WOOL QUARTERS (100 grams = 350 yards)

NOTE: if you want to knit a pair of socks larger than specified herein, please use 2 skeins.

NEEDLES: Double points (set of 5 needles) in #US 2 or size to meet gauge.

GAUGE: 7 stitches and 9 rows to the inch in stockinette.
ALWAYS DO TEST SWATCH TO DETERMINE NEEDLE SIZE THAT WORKS FOR YOU!

MEASUREMENTS:

Cuff circumference: 8" relaxed to 10" stretched.

Leg length, cuff to bottom of heel: approx. 10 ½ inches.

Foot length, bottom of heel to end of toe: approx. 10"

Size: Medium to Medium/Large

NOTE: In this pattern, always slip the slip stitches "as if to purl."

INSTRUCTIONS:

CUFF: Cast on 60 stitches in preferred cast-on method. Distribute stitches onto 4 needles (15 stitches on each needle), join in the round, being careful not to twist stitches, and work in-the-round in K3P3 rib for 2 ½ inches.

LEG: Knit 1 round.

BEGIN STITCH PATTERN:

Rnds 1,2,3,4:*P1,SL1 wyib, P1, K2.* Repeat * to* to end of round.

Rnd 5: Knit.

Rnds 6,7,8,9:*K2, P1, SL1 wyib, P1.* Repeat * to* to end of round.

Rnd 10: Knit.

Repeat this 10-round stitch pattern until sock leg measures approximately 8" from the cast-on round. End with either round 5 or Round 10 of the stitch pattern.

HEEL FLAP: At beginning of needle 1, K15. Turn.

Row1: SL1, P14, P the 15 stitches from needle 4. Turn.

Row 2: SL1, bring yarn from front to back between the slipped stitch and the next stitch, K the next stitch, *SL1, K1.* Repeat * to * to end of row. Turn.
Repeat Rows 1 & 2 until there are 15 chain stitches on each heel flap edge = 30 rows, ending with Row 2 of pattern.

TURN HEEL:

Row 1: SL1, P15, P2tog, P1, turn.

Row 2: SL1, K3, K2tog, K1, turn.

Row 3: SL1, P4, P2tog, P1, turn.

Row 4: SL1, K5, K2tog, K1, turn

Row 5: SL1, P6, P2tog, P1, turn.

Row 6: SL1, K7, K2tog, K1, turn.

Continue in this manner so that there's one more stitch in each row between the slipped stitch and the decrease until 16 stitches remain. End with a knit row.

INSTEP & SHAPE GUSSETS:

Round 1: Divide the 16 heel stitches onto 2 needles (8 stitches on needle 1, 8 stitches on needle 4).

Pick up and knit the 15 chain stitches along the left edge of heel flap (the side closest to needle 1 stitches). Work the 30 instep stitches (that have been on hold on needles 2 & 3).

With spare needle, pick up and knit the 15 chain stitches from right side of heel flap (side closest to needle 4) and knit the 8 heel shape stitches from needle 8. The beginning of the round is the mid-point between the heel shape stitches (8 on needle 1, 8 on needle 4). There will be 23 stitches on needles 1 & 4 and 15 stitches on needles 2 & 3 = 76 stitches.

Round 2: Knit to 3 stitches from end of needle 1, K2tog, K1. Work the 30 instep stitches on needles 2 & 3 in established pattern. On needle 4, K1, SSK, Knit to end of needle 4 (end of round).

Round 3: Knit the gusset stitches on needles 1 & 4, and work the instep stitches on needles 2&3 in established pattern.

Round 4: As in Round 2.

Repeats Rounds 3 & 4 until 60 stitches remain (15 stitches on each needle).

FOOT & INSTEP:

Work even in established pattern (knit the stitches on needles 1 & 4 and work in established pattern the stitches on needles 2 & 3) until foot measures approximately 8 inches from beginning of heel shaping or 2 inches less than desired length, ending the established pattern stitches in either Round 5 or Round 10 of the pattern stitch.

TOE SHAPING:

Rnd 1: *Knit to last 2 stitches on needle, K2tog.* repeat * to* on needles 2, 3 & 4.

Rnd 2: Knit to end of round.

Repeat Rnds 1 & 2 until 8 stitches remain on each needle (32 stitches). Be sure to knit 1 round after

Decreasing to the 32 stitches.

Now, repeat Round 1 until 2 stitches remain on each needle (8 stitches).

Cut yarn, and thread yarn through the remaining stitches.

FINISHING: With wool needle, secure ends using preferred finishing method.
